2019-2022 Duluth Area TIP/STIP Update

- The **Transportation Improvement Program** (TIP) lists all federally-funded transportation projects to be implemented in the MIC's planning area for the next four years.
- A project must be listed in **both** the Duluth-area TIP and the state-level STIP to receive FHWA (roadway) or FTA (transit) funds.
- The MIC's TIP development process includes a mandatory public comment period for the community to weigh in on projects to be funded with federal dollars.

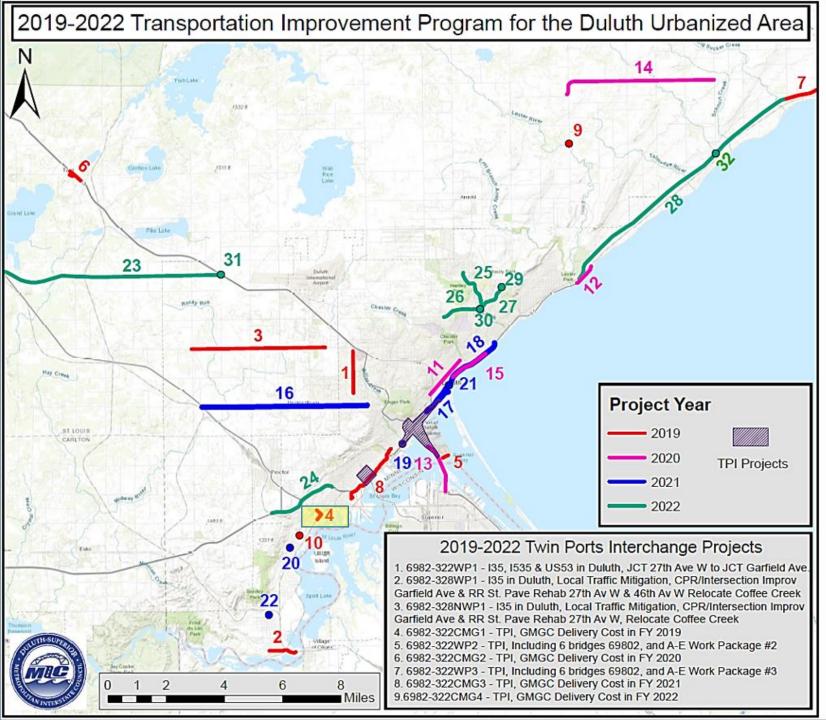

This Year's TIP Approval Process

September 2018

- Due to public comments received, the MIC Board voted to approve the 2019-2022 Duluth Area TIP <u>but to withhold approval</u> of one trail project.
- We were subsequently advised by FHWA that withholding one project would jeopardize funding for the entire \$428 million program of roadway and transit projects for the next 4 years.

This Year's TIP Approval Process

October 2018

The MIC Board voted to approve the entire TIP, including the trail project.

Why Did This Happen?

Unresolved issues at the jurisdiction level:

The trail project in question had undergone multiple changes to its scope and funding (since 2005) and many stakeholders had objections to the City's final project.

Last opportunity for public comment:

Several members of the public appeared at the September 2018 MIC Board meeting to express concerns about the City's trail project as proposed in the draft TIP.

State and local processes out of synch:

MnDOT had already approved its state-level TIP (STIP) before the MIC Board had a chance to approve its regional-level TIP.

What Processes Will be Changed?

Federal level

 FHWA has requested that MnDOT work with all Minnesota MPOs (including the MIC) to prevent this issue ("TIP-STIP nonalignment") from happening in the future.

State level

- MnDOT will change its STIP process so that final approval does not precede regional TIP approvals.
- MnDOT will work with their District personnel to communicate that MPOs (like the MIC) have a lead role in transportation planning and programming within in their urbanized areas (e.g., Duluth/Hermantown/ Proctor/Townships).

What Processes Will be Changed?

MPO level

- The MIC will accelerate its TIP development process so that the final version is approved by the MIC Board in June (instead of September).
- The MIC will not amend any projects into the new (Board-approved) TIP until it receives final federal approvals.

(For example, in accordance with the MIC's project application and public review process, it is expected that the Board will approve a new TIP for 2020-2023 in June. New projects can (only) be amended into the current (2019-2022) TIP, until the new (2020-2023) version is approved by MnDOT, FHWA and FTA.

What Processes Will be Changed?

Jurisdiction level

 Projects need to be properly vetted by the agency or jurisdiction that submits them to the MIC for inclusion in the TIP — so that public concerns can come forward for resolution before they are proposed for federal funding.
