

 - Duluth 1st Street Conversion Study Recently in the news, Duluth has hired a consulting group to examine the First Street corridor in the downtown to potentially change the road from a predominately one-way street to a two-way directional street for its entire length (including in the hospital zone area). Currently, First Street is a mix of two directional and one directional along its length, leading to a bit of confusion for the driver. Though good for traffic flow, the one-ways have some problematic issues such as direct access to locales. The MIC is assisting the City's consultant with usage of our Travel Demand Model that aids in the forecasting of traffic flow efficiency concerning one directional versus bi-directional movement.
 - Superior Active Transportation Plan The City is soon to kick-off the Active Transportation Plan with Toole Design assisting as consultants. The MIC will be assisting on the technical team too. The plan is to start at this time and take 12 months to conclude. Certainly, the MIC will be bringing quite a bit of background from our Bikeways Plan into the planning process.
 - WISDOT and Future of Transportation Summit Later this month, the DOT is set to unveil at a gathering in Milwaukee, a set of transportation issues/policies (in this new administration) including financing, economic impacts and modal components, including a key one of freight. The line-up includes a discussion of port initiatives as well. Also this month, Sheldon Johnson and I will be meeting with the new Secretary – Craig Thompson – to discuss a number of items important to MPOs and RPCs.

6. I-35/BAYFRONT PROJECT UPDATE

• Presentation and Discussion, Ron Chicka

The project is moving forward to its conclusion. On March 1, Alliant Engineering consultant Nick VanGunst met with a large group of Bayfront- and DECC-area stakeholders. Meeting participants the data collected as well as the draft recommendations. We will give an overview of the short- and long- term management strategies, which include:

- 1. Improvements to wayfinding for alternate parking locations on Garfield Ave and Michigan Street
- 2. Improvements to pedestrian access across 5th Avenue W and skywalk and defined crossing points
- 3. Promotion of existing DTA bus services with connection to Skywalk
- 4. Improvements to signal timing at 5th Ave W off I-35
- 5. Remote parking and shuttle services
- 6. Communication strategies via websites and media notifications
- 7. Use of MnDOT's Dynamic Message Signs
- 8. Preferred/reserved parking strategy, premium pricing

The fourth and last stakeholder meeting, to review and finalize the Plan's recommendations, is scheduled for April 24th, prior to a public meeting about the plan to be held in Mid-May. Implementation can begin for events beginning Summer 2019.

9. PROJECT UPDATES

• Campus Connector Trail

The City of Duluth and the MIC conducted a walk-through of the entire proposed trail alignment and held the first stakeholder group meeting. This meeting provided an overview of the project, allowed for opportunities to answer questions and then followed with an extensive review of the initial trail alignment that been identified over the past years. Stakeholders marked on maps their areas of concern as well as alternative trail alignments. Following this stakeholder meeting, a public meeting, including the release of a survey, is in the works for late April.

• Bus, Bike, Walk Month

The month of May in the Twin Ports is Bus, Bike, Walk Month. Though this year the event Has extended further into the months of April and June as well. This year's series of events include educational trainings and a variety of encouragement activities that are for people of all ages and abilities. With the Superior Active Transportation Plan about to get rolling, there is an expanded focus on Superior, including Bike to School day stations for students at the K-12 schools, UWS and a Superior Mayor's Bike Ride and Luncheon. • DTA 2019-2022 TIP Administrative Modification #4
