- Wisconsin Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) Update In meetings with the City of Superior, Douglas Co and the DOT, we reached an agreement that for 2023 funds (approx. \$74K) the City would pursue an application to use the funds toward replacing street lighting with energy efficient alternatives; LEDs. The corridor that is being considered is East 2<sup>nd</sup> (Hwys 2/53); a specified section of mileage could be replaced. The City will be notified in a couple of months and, if awarded, the project would need to be included in the Wisconsin TIP.
- Roundabout Hwys. 2 and 194 On Tuesday, April 18, 2023, at 5:30 p.m., Minnesota Department of Transportation staff will be holding an information meeting about construction of a roundabout at Highway 2 and Highway 194 and resurfacing work at the Solway Town Hall (4029 Munger Shaw Rd, Cloquet, MN 55720).

#### **TIP AMENDMENT #11**

#### RAISE Grant for West Superior St, City of Duluth Project ID 118-109-021RA

A TIP amendment has been requested to add a new project to the 2023-2026 Duluth Area TIP. The City of Duluth was awarded a Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) discretionary grant award for the Lincoln Park Active Transportation Corridor project on West Superior Street. The City was awarded this RAISE grant funding by the U.S. DOT in August 2022. The project is a full reconstruction of 1.6 miles of West Superior Street from Carlton Street to West Michigan Street.

Design and preliminary engineering work is currently underway. Construction is scheduled to start in 2025.

Based on the criteria adopted in the MIC Public Involvement Plan, this addition requires a formal TIP amendment to the 2023-2026 Duluth Area TIP.
