



#### 1. INTRODUCTIONS / AGENDA REVIEW

- **2.** COMMITTEE BUSINESS
  - Meeting Summary of 6.20.23\*
  - Directors Report
    - Safety Action Plan Update 2023 and 2024 The MIC is working on dual fronts for this work task. For this year, as the MIC Board recently took action on, we're moving Phase 2 of our work involving analysis of our crash database to become an appendix to our Metropolitan Transportation Plan; with analysis being conducted by AECOM. They have developed a scope and we're discussing next steps now. This work program amendment has also recently been approved by the DOT and FHWA from both states allowing work to commence. On a second front, we have applied for the federal grant program Safe Streets for All to the tune of \$250K for a policy-based plan that will set this area up for future infrastructure grants via this same program. Nearly all MPOs in the nation are looking to this new program to get a federally recognized document set in place. We're to find out about the award in the Fall of this year.
    - MIC Staffing Update For our current Planner/Senior Planner opening, we had a very limited pool to choose from for an interview. We had five apply; two were qualified and when one pulled out, we ended up with one interview. That person proved to be good; an offer was made, but it was not accepted, and we will have to re-post. A key task to fill is the HTAC coordinator role for the MIC that requires very astute relationship skills as it is our largest committee and very diverse in membership.
    - I-35 Plan Update As this project is nearing conclusion, two other related events are occurring where we will be actively involved. First, I will be taking part in an August 30 event at Mn Power of a program put on by the UMD Bureau of Business and Economic Research with speakers and a walking tour focused on the future of downtown Duluth and its relationship to the freeway. Second, on September 8<sup>th</sup> on the U of MN campus in St Paul, our project is on the MN Freight Advisory Committee agenda to be presented for discussion and input form this important group that is made up of public and private sector interests from across the state, including the DOT Commissioner. In addition, the City of Duluth is preparing to submit a grant to the



federal Reconnecting Communities Program to further examine the West Duluth and downtown segments of the freeway. Our current consultant, AECOM, is preparing the application.

• **Duluth Transit Authority (DTA) Triennial Review** – Both Rondi Watson (DTA Board Chair) and I will be participating in this federal review of the full range of services provided to the area by the DTA; including planning work conducted by federal partners such as the MPO. We review the progression of the TIP and transit projects included plus other working arrangements that should be in place between the transit agency and the MPO.

# 4. DRAFT 2024-2027 SUPERIOR AREA TIP RELEASE FOR 30-DAY PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON AUGUST 25, 2023\*

On approval, the MIC will release the 2024-2027 Superior Area TIP for public comment for a 30-day period, beginning August 25, 2023. At this time, our lists of public projects for Fiscal Years 2024-2027 should be complete for the time being, according to our input from our constituent jurisdictions. After this public comment period, any pertinent comments received will be incorporated into the final version of the TIP, with the action to adopt to be included in the agenda for the September 2023 MIC Board meeting.

#### 5. FINAL 2024-2027 DULUTH AREA TIP\*

The Public Comment Period for the 2024-2027 Duluth Area TIP concluded on July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023. There were 4 minor changes that were identified by our jurisdictions that have been made. However, none of the changes required a renewal of the public comment period. As such, the final version has been finished and prepared for adoption by the MIC Policy Board, August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

#### 6. DRAFT MIC URBAN AREA BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT

Updating the Urbanized Area Boundary is done every 10 years and is based on the 2020 Census. We are allowed to make the boundary bigger but in no way can we reduce the boundary smaller than the original 2020 Census Boundary. This boundary includes full area of any jurisdiction that the 2020 Census Urban Area entered. We have also met with both state DOT's for input on our Adjusted Urbanized Area.

#### 7. 2024-2025 MIC WORK PROGRAM DISCUSSION

We will present the items/tasks for inclusion in the draft 2024-25 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) at our upcoming meeting(s). (Budget amounts for each individual project are being further refined; we can speak to budget sources – not much change from what is already noted in the existing UPWP.) A key work task for 2024 will be approval of the updated Long-Range Plan for the MIC; considerable amount of time from both staff and our consultant is directed at this one item. Within our Bike-Pedestrian element, it is time to update our Bike Plan itself. In Short Range, we anticipate an amendment next year that incorporates the federal grant we applied for toward the Safe Streets for All program. There would be staff time plus the larger amount (\$250K) we requested. Lastly, we will discuss a discretionary project (would need consultant help) for an areawide Traffic Signal Assessment Plan that we have received several favorable comments by the MIC members to conduct. Final UPWP approval is anticipated in September.



#### 8. DULUTH AREA I-35 CORRIDOR STUDY UPDATE

To date, Bolton & Menk, the MIC's consultant for the I-35 Corridor Plan, has completed a technical assessment of the 14-mile study corridor and developed design alternatives to address the identified deficiencies. In addition, the scope of work was expanded, with financial assistance from MnDOT, to conduct a more detailed analysis of the Thompson Hill area to better understand and document environmental concerns and to further refine design concepts which may include a truck climbing lane.

The proposed designs for key intersections along the entire 14-mile study corridor were presented in May to the Project Steering Committee and to the TAC and the MIC for feedback. Subsequently, selected designs were presented for feedback to two focus groups, representing port/freight and Downtown/Canal Park interests.

A public open house was held on June 6 and generated a great deal of interest. More than 50 people showed up in person, and 366 survey responses were received. A summary of Phase 2 public engagement will be presented at this month's TAC and MIC meetings.

#### **10. PROJECT UPDATES**

#### • Carbon Reduction Plan (CRP)

2024 is the first year of CRP fund allocation. CRP funds have been incorporated into the 2024-2027 Duluth Area TIP. 2024 funds have been allocated to Woodland Ave pedestrian improvements (St. Louis County), with placeholders for following years. Additionally, MnDOT will be submitting a Carbon Reduction Strategy with further guidance for CRP projects from FY 2025 to FHWA November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

#### • 2050 Update of the MIC's Long-Range Transportation Plan

The 2050 update of the MIC's 2045 long-range Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) is now underway, with the assistance of consultants AECOM, through this year and next. Adoption of the 2050 update by the Policy Board is required by October 2024. An early step, to take place in late August, is for our staff to conduct the first of two MIC-area jurisdictional consultations. The goal of the first consultation is to review updated demographics and to gain input into observed and emerging transportation issues; the second round of consultations, to occur later this fall, will be to discuss potential improvement projects and inter-jurisdictional coordination.
