- 1. INTRODUCTIONS / AGENDA REVIEW
- **2.** COMMITTEE BUSINESS
  - Meeting Summary of 12.13.23\*
  - MIC Director's Report
  - Safety Action Plan Update 2024 AECOM and the area jurisdictional partners will continue to work throughout the year due to the Work Program amendment (using one-time 2023 carryover funding) proposed for formal action this month. The tasks outlined in consultation with our consultant will take the plan to its conclusion and provide a roadmap for addressing the highest priority locations/corridors regarding multimodal safety needs in the MIC area.
  - I-35 Plan Update The final plan is on our website. Also, presentations of the work to the Fond du Lac Tribe in Cloquet plus the Duluth Superior Maritime Club to gain input and feedback. A further technical study concerning the possibility of applying variable speed limits along the corridor will be underway soon; addressed as a follow-up task in the plan.
  - Superior Tower Avenue Plan Meetings continue with City and Wisconsin DOT staff as we review the traffic operations study recently completed by AECOM. Once again, this study involves the feasibility of lane reduction along Tower between Belknap and 28<sup>th</sup> Street. The plan was a first step toward this potential change; purely technical and without public or private sector input. When ready for a broader level presentation to the TAC and MIC, we will try to line up a presentation.
  - Letters of Support MIC staff has had multiple requests from area jurisdictions toward projects proposed for the metro area. These include:
    - St Louis County Rice Lake Road Corridor Following on the County's presentation last month, we've submitted a letter of support toward their request for federal funds to carry out their preliminary planning efforts. The MIC Board took an official action approving the letter.
    - 2) NWRPC Our Wisconsin host agency has asked for a letter toward a climate resilience project for continued flood plain management work particularly a road/stream crossing evaluation in the Nemadji River watershed via National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA). A key aspect of the MICs Long Range Plan and within our planning area.



3) City of Duluth – Signature toward a grant for lighting of the improved bike-pedestrian crossing of I-35 near the Mesaba Avenue interchange.

# 3. 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue East Restriping Project

6<sup>th</sup> Avenue East in Duluth, from just north of the medical complex area to Mesaba Avenue, will undergo a 4 to 3-lane conversion via restriping this summer. This has been analyzed as to feasibility for many years, including work from the MIC in the past. Mainly, this is being done to make this corridor more multimodal in nature and less of a barrier to the surrounding neighborhoods, improved pedestrian, bike and bus accommodations. City staff will discuss the upcoming project for the TAC and MIC Board.

# 5. 2024-2027 DULUTH AREA TIP AMENDMENTS #4-5\*

**Amendment** #4 – MnDOT is requesting the addition of a new project on MN 23 from W 5<sup>th</sup> St to 121<sup>st</sup> Ave W using STBGP funds (TIP Project ID # 6910-116). This project includes the removal and replacement of bituminous pavement.

- Total project cost = \$2,000,000
  - Federal funding = \$1,628,400
  - State funding = \$371,600

**Amendment #5** – MnDOT is requesting the addition of a new project related to the Blatnik Bridge, using Bridge Formula Funding (BFP, TIP Project ID # 6981-26PLT). This project is for engineering consultation; bridge pile load testing.

- Total project cost = \$3,000,000
  - Federal funding = \$2,700,000
  - State funding = \$300,000

# 6. 2024-2025 UPWP AMENDMENT #1\*

We will be proposing an amendment right away in the new year to our recently approved budget for 2024. This was mentioned at our December meetings. We have a very large balance from 2023 mostly due to the fact of being short a Planner position for 2/3 of the year. This has not ever occurred since I've been employed with the MIC. But, as the marketplace goes now, especially for experienced staff, this issue is becoming more commonplace around the country – and really in many different professional fields. So, after consultation with MNDOT, they are allowing us to do this budget adjustment. The source(s) to be carried over are from the MN side federal funds and accompanying local (ARDC) match to those federal dollars. Only those two sources. This is done via an 80% federal – 20% local calculation. As of this mailing, the exact value is still being determined. However, it is approximately \$100,000 in total. So, \$80,000 in federal funds; \$20,000 local match.

It is being proposed that the funds go straight to completing the extensive work of the areawide Safety Action Plan (all MIC jurisdiction crash analysis and recommendation work) plus a couple of added tasks to our main document of the MIC, our Long Range Plan, due for approval later this year. Both are being conducted with our consultant, AECOM, assisting MIC staff.

#### 7. LONG RANGE MTP 2050 – STAKEHOLDER INVOLVEMENT SUMMARY

Throughout 2023, we've been listening to stakeholders in the Duluth-Superior metropolitan area as they describe their vision for the region's transportation system, key areas of concern, and big ideas for the future. In a public survey, interviews, and focus groups, people from the region have told us what's important to them. This presentation will give some highlights of what we've heard so far and ask for your thoughts as well.

## 9. PROJECT UPDATES

## • Administrative Modification #3 to the 2024-2027 Duluth Area TIP

This modification, approved by MIC staff, is a group of edits to the current TIP document (Duluth Area 2024-2027 TIP) to include updated safety performance measures to include the most recent data from MnDOT.

## • Administrative Modification #4 to the 2024-2027 Duluth Area TIP

This modification, approved by MIC staff, is related to an existing MnDOT project in the current 2024-2027 TIP to secure Early Procurement (EP) in 2024 of lighting equipment for the planned improvements along Hwy 61 (Project ID # 6926-57). EP will use \$50,000 of the project's existing budget and remain fiscally constrained.

# • Administrative Modification #5 to the 2024-2027 Duluth Area TIP

This modification, approved by MIC staff, is related to an existing MnDOT project in the current '24-'27 TIP to secure Early Procurement (EP) in 2024 of expansion joints for planned bridge improvements along the I-35 corridor from Lake Ave to 21<sup>st</sup> Ave E. EP will use \$90,000 of the project's existing budget and remain fiscally constrained.

# • Long Range MTP 2050 – Jurisdictional Meetings Update

Jurisdictional consultations are an important part of the development of a long-range Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), such as the MIC's *Sustainable Choices* 2050. MIC staff recently facilitated two jurisdictional consultations, one in Minnesota and one in Wisconsin. Thirteen people participated in the Minnesota consultation representing MnDOT, St. Louis County, the City of Duluth, the City of Proctor, DTA, Duluth Airport Authority, St. Louis County Emergency Management, Duluth Seaway Port Authority, and the MIC. Seven people participated in the Wisconsin consultation representing WisDOT, the City of Superior, and the MIC. In a departure from past MTP development efforts these jurisdictional consultations were held as group meetings for the purpose of encouraging cooperative interactions to better understand and discuss the MIC area's



multimodal transportation network. This purpose was achieved during both consultations.

Following introductions and a brief high-level overview presentation to provide context for the consultation the agenda items were for each jurisdiction to estimate the current condition and performance of its multimodal transportation network, identify projects within the past 5 years that highlight improvements in condition and performance, identify the most pressing needs to improve condition and performance, identify proposed federally-funded and/or regionally significant projects to be included in the MTP, and an estimate of costs versus expected revenue for their proposed list of projects. Jurisdictions were able to ask questions of each other or share information that was helpful for others and/or the entire MIC area multimodal transportation network.

# • Letter of Support for the Rice Lake Road Corridor Improvement Project

We prepared a letter of support on behalf of the MIC for St. Louis County's Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grant for the Rice Lake Road Corridor Project. The program supports state and local jurisdictions to complete critical freight and passenger transportation infrastructure projects.
