

 - Exercise & implement the Area Maritime Security Plan
 - Establish & direct the Area Maritime Security Committee.





Titles & Authority




- Officer in Charge of Marine Inspection (OCMI)
 - Carry out vessel inspections of U.S. & foreign vessels
 - Investigate marine casualties or accidents on U.S. navigable waters
- Federal On-Scene Coordinator (FOSC)



- 4 Winter layup Vessels2020-2021




Investigation Activities
