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




Overview

Northern Lights Express (NLX)

- Minneapolis to Duluth/Superior 4 daily roundtrips
- 2.5-hour travel time competitive with driving
- Capital improvements
 - Track upgrades and new and extended sidings
 - Upgrade signals
 - Grade crossing improvements
 - New and expanded stations
- \$194.7 million State funding provides matching dollars to seek federal funding for
 - Final design and construction
 - Purchase locomotives and cars NLX and TCMC



Where are we now

- Corridor Identification and Development Program (Corridor ID)
 - NLX was accepted into the program in December 2023
 - New Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) program
 - Funds project development work
 - Goal is to create a "prioritized pipeline" of projects that are ready for capital funding
 - FRA will prioritize projects in the Corridor ID program for capital funding under other grant programs

Corridor ID Steps

Step 1

- Scoping
- FRA funds 100% up to \$500K


Step 2

- Service Development Planning (SDP)
- FRA funds 90%

Step 3

- Preliminary Engineering
- NEPA
- FRA funds 80%

Complimentary Projects

- Hinkley Corridor Grade Crossing Elimination and Improvement Study
 - Same corridor as NLX
 - \$600,000 study partially funded by a Federal Railroad Administration grant
 - Planning study to identify opportunities to define and implement a multi-year, multiphase program to
 - Identify improvements to increase safety of motorists and pedestrians
 - Eliminate trespassing
 - Focus is on freight, with an eye towards passenger rail
 - Study timeline mid-2024 through 2025
 - Grant agreement is in process

Complimentary Projects


Moving Greater Minnesota Forward Program

- First innovative mobility incubator in the United States
- Focus rural, tribal and small urban areas (less than 200,000)
- East Central Regional Development Commission is a partner
 - Collaborating to look at mobility hubs for different transit providers to connect riders
 - Includes NLX stations
 - Seeking assistance from local transportation partners to develop a regional needs assessment and feasibility study for hubs

- WisDOT supports MnDOT' efforts to jointly collaborate on aspects of projects and studies that provide service through both states, including:
 - NLX Minneapolis to Duluth/Superior service
 - Saint Paul to Minneapolis service linking
 Saint Paul Union Depot to Target Field Station





Wisconsin Corridor ID Selections

WisDOT Sponsored Corridors

 Milwaukee to Chicago Hiawatha Service Corridor Expansion 	Increase frequencies from 7 to 10 daily round trips
2. Twin Cities–Milwaukee–Chicago – Second Round Trip	Add a second daily frequency to state supported route
3. Milwaukee–Madison–Eau Claire–Twin Cities	Establish new passenger rail service between Milwaukee and the Twin Cities
4. Milwaukee to Green Bay Hiawatha Service Extension	Extend Hiawatha service from Milwaukee to Green Bay
Other S	ponsored Corridors
A. Eau Claire to Twin Cities	Establish new passenger rail service between Eau Claire and Twin Cities
B. Northern Lights Express – Minneapolis to Duluth/Superior	MnDOT application for new passenger rail service
