1. Introductions / Agenda Review

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• Director’s Report

Director Chicka gave a brief overview of the items that were listed in the meeting materials. Ron continues to work on finding an All-Abilities representative to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC). He has reached out to the City of Superior who may have a person in mind for fulfilling the vacancy.

Director Chicka stated that a revised Joint Powers Agreement between ARDC and NWRPC has been submitted to state and federal agencies for their review. ARDC Executive Director, Betsy Olivanti, noted that this is just a draft. There may be revisions after we hear back from MnDOT and WisDOT. A Board member requested a copy of the draft JPA. Board Co-Chair, Nick Baker, stated that it should get sent out to the full board.

Director Chicka continued on to say that a survey will go out this week to assist the MIC in finding a time that will work for most members, so that that board meetings could occur during the day, to accommodate for jurisdictional staff to be present for answering questions, as requested by some Policy Board members.

Board discussion occurred surrounding the proposed change to the meeting times. A comment was made that a change to earlier in the day is burdensome for those members who work and would need to take time off to be able to attend. This is also a burden to the public who work and cannot attend. A suggestion was made that space be provided in the survey for board members to offer their ideas on how to accomplish the goal of professional staff attendance at board meetings. Deputy Director, Sheldon Johnson, reminded members that the agenda packets are distributed a week in advance and allows time for review and questions to be asked in advance of the Policy Board meetings. A member commented that all the materials are not made available one week in advance of the meeting; some only a day or two in advance. *(After the meeting, it was later clarified to this member that all required materials are provided one week in advance; the presentations are not always ready for posting to the webpage and not guaranteed posted until after the meeting has occurred.)* Another



member asked how close the TAC meets to the Policy Board. (1 day, currently.) Could Policy Board members receive a notification of the TAC meeting and they could choose to attend if they wish? Additionally, April is a better time for the City of Superior representatives in relation to the change of meeting schedule. Councilors renew or choose new boards to sit on at this time and may choose accordingly, knowing the new meeting schedule.

3. 2026-2029 Duluth Area TIP Amendment #9*

The DTA requested an amendment to add a new project (State Project ID # TRF-0016-26J) to the 2026-2029 Duluth Area TIP. This is a grant that is new to the TIP to fund the purchase of two Class 300 buses for paratransit service. The project is programmed for Fiscal Year (FY) 2026, and the grant includes \$402,176 in FTA funds. The DTA will be contributing \$100,544 in local match for a total project cost of \$502,720.

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4. Draft 2027-2030 Superior Area TIP – Release for 30-Day Public Comment Period on September 1, 2026*

The 2027-2030 Superior Area Draft TIP has been posted to the MIC website for review by TAC/MIC members and other technical oversight. Sheldon Johnson reviewed the ten new projects being added, noted that the TIP includes DTA expenditures and that forty-one projects are being removed. Sheldon stated that they did not go out for a new TIP last year and that is partially why there is a higher number of projects leaving this round. MIC staff is requesting approval for the release of the Draft TIP for the 30-Day Public Comment Period beginning on September 1 and ending on September 30, 2026.

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6. Draft 2027-2030 Duluth Area TIP – 30-Day Public Comment Summary

Eli Norlander gave an overview of the comments received during the 30-day public comment period for the 2027-2030 Duluth Area TIP. The MIC held two virtual and one in-person open houses for the public to attend. Total attendance was two people. Several questions and comments were asked by one member of the public and were forwarded to jurisdictions. Each comment receives a response. MIC staff will incorporate recommended changes made by the jurisdictions and the final draft will be sent out with the TAC and MIC meeting agenda packets one week prior to the September meetings. The final TIP will be presented for adoption by the MIC Policy Board on September 16, 2026, and will include all comments received during the Public Comment Period.

7. Draft 2027-2028 MIC Work Program & Budget

Ron Chicka presented an overview of the draft MIC Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for 2027. The draft was sent to state and federal agencies for Minnesota and Wisconsin for their review on August 5, 2026. While the MIC awaits comments and recommendations, the budget and programmed work elements are closer to being finalized. Discretionary funds are available in some years, and jurisdiction's technical staff give the MIC suggestions throughout the year on ways the MIC can help; these funds can be used in this way. During the TAC meeting, DTA noted that its Transit Development Plan Update will be starting in 2027 and provides an opportunity for MIC staff involvement. The MIC will incorporate this task into the Transit element for 2027.

8. Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) & Safe Routes to School Updates

The BPAC met in August for their quarterly meeting, and Eli Norlander presented some highlights from the meeting. This meeting offered the BPAC its first opportunity to use the new BPAC Project Review Process. Eli reported that the MIC will be hosting an e-bike workshop for emergency response agencies, including Police and other technical staff from jurisdictions.

Eli Norlander went on to give an overview of the Duluth Safe Routes to School Plan (SRTS) that the ARDC Planning Division has been coordinating, and which he has been assisting with the planning tasks. This is the first SRTS plan for Duluth since it was last completed in 2006. The district has a wide service area. The project, which is supported by a grant by MnDOT, kicked off in the fall of 2025 and highlights accomplishments of the past plans by describing improvements that have been implemented since 2006. Several notable projects have been completed that improve transportation safety surrounding Duluth school zones.

The Duluth Safe Routes to School Plan is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2026 and will include infrastructure recommendations, as well as programming recommendations that can aid in planning and implementation projects in the years ahead.

9. Harbor Technical Advisory Committee (HTAC) Update

The HTAC met on June 3, with a nice variety of harbor-related topics, including the bylaws revision as noted earlier in this Policy Board agenda. Other topics of interest were a report from the St. Louis River area of concern to update on the progress that occurred in 2025. Representatives for the St. Louis Estuary Long Term Monitoring



and Assessment Plans, gave a presentation on the program, which occurs all over the country to monitor how we are doing with our water quality.

Chad Scott, of AMI Consulting Engineers, PA, presented on the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) Minnesota Infrastructure Report Card. The grades reflect the condition and performance of the infrastructure systems. Overall, the State of Minnesota received a “C” for its infrastructure, and the Minnesota Ports also received a “C”. For individual grade results for the different areas of infrastructure, please refer to the presentation on the meeting webpage.

Other topics from the June HTAC meeting included the winter work of the Great Lakes Fleet, as well as the icebreaking operations of the US Coast Guard Cutter, Spar, the only military ship that currently sails the Great Lakes. This ship aids in navigation missions and performs ice breaking and buoy maintenance operations during some of the coldest months of the year.

10. Apprise from the MIC Board Members

- Member Baker noted that he experienced today a little of what he anticipates at the roundabout when the Blatnik is closed for reconstruction. The bridge was temporarily closed today due to a semi-truck incident, and he said traffic was backed up.
- Member Van Sickle stated that the City of Superior’s Preemptive Signaling System contract was signed last week. Supplies are being ordered and construction is likely next year. She went on to ask about the status of a grant that the DTA had received to improve bus shelters in the City of Superior. Does anyone have an update? Councilor Moffat said he had spoken with Chris and that they are coming soon.

11. Project Updates

- **Administrative Modifications #5-6 to the 2026-2029 Duluth Area TIP**
